



## Norbert Reithofer Re-elected Chairman of Supervisory Board


THE CURRENT CHAIRMAN OF THE SUPERVISORY BOARD OF BMW AG, DR.-Ing. Norbert Reithofer, has been re-elected to the Supervisory Board for a period of five years at the company's Annual General Meeting, held on May 14th. At a meeting of the Supervisory Board held after the shareholders' meeting, he was also re-elected as its chairman. Reithofer has been associated with BMW AG for more than three decades. He joined the company in

1987 and was Chairman of the Board of Management between 2006 and 2015. He has been Chairman of the Supervisory Board since 2015.



## **Summer Reading**



IF YOU'RE LOOKING FOR SOME GOOD SUMMER READING, let me recommend the most recent publication from the BMW CCA Foundation and Jackie Jouret. This is the fourth major installation at the BMW CCA Foundation Museum and the fourth book published by the Foundation, to accompany the exhibition. The opening for Genesis—BMW From the Beginning, was supposed to be in May. Because of the recent unpleasantness, the opening was cancelled.

However, there is a good video of the show narrated by Jackie Jouret on the Foundation's website. Plus, copies of the book are now available. Your Editorin-Chief read it cover-to-cover and it is terrific. I find the early history of BMW, particularly the 1930s through the 1950s, to be the most interesting part of the company's backstory. I think I know a lot about BMW's history, but I learned a lot from this book.

As usual, the production values are first rate with good paper, clean layout and high-quality photography throughout. The featured cars, from Club members, are amazing, and they all have a story to tell.

The paperback version of the book is \$65. While you're at it, if you don't have the three earlier books, you might take the opportunity to pick up one or more of those. They're a lot better than television.
