

CHALLENGE GRANT

"Through the diligent efforts of many," Campaign Chair Mike Ura announced this month, "the \$250,000 campaign Challenge Grant was matched dollar-fordollar by the BMW CCA membership, accounting for a combined \$500,000 in gifts to the campaign. We are extremely grateful, not only to the generous, anonymous Challenge Grant donor, but to the hundreds of BMW CCA members and Chapters who made this possible."

A list of the Challenge Grant donors begins on page 4 of this newsletter. Several additional Chapter gifts are still expected, following their scheduled January meetings. They will be listed in future Campaign Checkpoint newsletters.

The \$7 million capital campaign began in July 2013

and is anticipated to take approximately three years to complete. The campaign will strengthen and expand the Tire Rack Street Survival® program, create a new and permanent home for the Foundation, and also establish a facility on newly purchased land next to the BMW Performance Center. The facility will house the BMW CCA Library and Archive and create a space to display up to 20 cars on a rotating basis. The campaign has generated \$1,065,000 to date.

During the campaign, whose activities are being driven by a 10-person campaign Steering Committee, businesses and individuals who are involved in any way with the BMW CCA or the Foundation will be approached and asked for support. Progress will be reported quarterly in this Campaign Checkpoint Newsletter.

TIRE RACK STREET SURVIVAL®

The BMW Car Club of America Foundation crossed a milestone in December 2013 by hosting the 101st Tire Rack Street Survival® school of 2013 and the 600th school of the program's 11-year history. Twenty-five students in Birmingham, AL, completed the one-day advanced teen driver education school, propelling the program past its 100-school goal for the year.

According to the most recent statistics available, more than 5,000 young drivers (ages 15-20) were involved in fatal car crashes, with more than 1,900 fatalities and 180,000 injured behind the wheel, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. To address the single largest killer of teens in America, The BMW Car Club of America Foundation developed a national non-profit driver education program aimed at teaching teens the skills they need to stay alive behind the wheel, now known as Tire Rack Street Survival®, 11 years ago.

The Tire Rack Street Survival® program is designed to teach students real-world elements of car control and enhance basic situational awareness, ultimately raising their enjoyment of driving. More importantly, the program improves a young driver's competence to react to unforeseen events and dangerous road conditions.

"We want students to understand how their actions govern a car's responses," said Bill Wade, national program manager. "As a result, they will become safer, more effective drivers on the road." Unlike other advanced driving schools, Tire Rack Street Survival® students use the vehicle they will drive most, either their own or one from a parent, so new skills can be directly translated to their own daily driving experiences. During the program, students maneuver their vehicles through a variety of real-road situations, including: advanced acceleration, turning and emergency breaking exercises, which are laid out with orange traffic cones in a closed parking lot. Drivers experience each exercise element several times in order to learn from their mistakes and improve their skills. There is no stopwatch or head-to-head competition with other drivers.

Tire Rack Street Survival's success in saving the lives of America's youth, one driver at a time, is made possible by the volunteers from The BMW Car Club of America, The Sports Car Club of America, The Porsche Club of America and other independent auto enthusiast groups. The program is also made affordable by generous support from Tire Rack, Michelin North America, Enterprise Rent-A -Car, BMW North America, the SCCA Foundation and Sprint.

For five years, the Foundation home was a 3,000 square foot office and warehouse in a commercial building. As time went on, it was clear we needed to move to a larger facility. Not only was this facility crammed with the Archive materials, but we also filled three storage units. In 2012, with one year left on our lease, we began our capital campaign.

On October 21, 2013, our dream became a reality. No more leasing: we were now the proud owners of a 15,000-square-foot office and warehouse we could call our own home! No more sharing a parking lot with other companies in the building (which we had a measly two spots allocated for our office). We can now host a car show in our own parking lot and surrounding property without bothering anyone! What is even better than having this new home is the fact we are literally right next door to the BMW Performance Center and across the street from the BMW Manufacturing plant. Yes, that is right, we share the fence line with the BMW Performance Center. We hear the squealing tires and rewing engines from the Performance Center cars on a regular basis...ahh, such ambient music for our office.

Although the excitement of having a new home was high for everyone involved, the Curator had a lot of anxiety about the move itself.

We had a mountain of stuff from the Archives

and office to move, some of

it quite rare and fragile. We hired a professional moving company with vast experience moving museums. It took ten movers with two box trucks, along with a half-dozen Foundation employees and volunteers, to move 17 truckloads in four days. Let me repeat that – 17 truckloads in four days! Gone are the days when we moved with a few pickup trucks and half a dozen club members in one day. The moving crew, just like a well-rehearsed orchestra, did a phenomenal job moving everything. The Curator was able to rest easy

with only a minor complaint or two about the move. All the important stuff made it safely to the new building. Goodbye to our small office and three storage units. For once, our entire Archive collection could be seen in just one place.

Oh, but the fun isn't over now just because we moved. We have a long road ahead of us to get our new space organized and into shape. Several volunteers worked as much as two weeks to help set up the general office area, display stuff in the showroom cabinets, hang pictures on the walls, organize our online store stock, and much more. Just like any home move, it will take us quite a bit of time to finish organizing everything. However, because of the size of the Foundation's Archives and because it continues to grow, it may never be fully organized.

The Foundation is comprised of three parts – Tire Rack Street Survival®, Preservation, and the Library, Archives, and Museum (LAM). This new facility will serve as the home base for Street Survival, as well as housing Preservation and the LAM of the Foundation. We currently have two cars on display in our showroom – a clone E30 M3 Art Car once raced by Ray Korman (this belongs to the Foundation), as well as a very clean example of an E30 325is on loan from a BMW CCA member. In the future, we plan to display many more cars and motorcycles for our museum.

The LAM is probably the largest collection of BMW-related materials outside of BMW AG's Classic in Germany. You ask, "What is in this collection?" Well,

you name it and we probably have it. Our collection has hundreds of brochures going back to the early days of BMW, a wall of shelves full of repair, parts, and wiring diagram manuals, as well as press kits, videos, magazine collections, chapter newsletters, tons of posters, prints, and artwork. We have all kinds of memorabilia: from die-cast models, BMW CCA Oktoberfest items, clothing, racing trophies, even a massive collection of broken race car parts – like a hood from an E92 M3 GT or a wheel from the E46 M3 GTR, and even a complete set of tires from the McLaren F1 GTR - the Ultimate BMW! Part of our database is listed on our website. Go to www.bmwccafoundation.org and visit the Archives page. Currently, we have approximately 4,500 items in the database. In our building, we easily have 30,000 to 40,000 items...a long road ahead for our Curator to catalog. The challenge has been set to see how long it will take the Curator to fill this building like he did in the old space!

If you are coming to SC to visit the factory, picking up a new car or taking a driving school at the PC, or simply just driving through SC, we invite you to stop by to see the Foundation's new home. We would be happy to show you around. Our hours are usually Monday through Friday, 8:30am to 5pm. After your tour, you can sign our wall of signatures.

BMW CAR CLUB OF AMERICA FOUNDATION and STREET SURVIVAL TEEN DRIVER EDUCATION
