✓. LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

Spring is finally upon us! Street Survival Schools are ramping up. Classic BMWs are coming out of their winter homes and hitting the roads. And, Oktoberfest is only a month away! The other phenomena of spring is a strong desire from enthusiasts to get involved in the Capital Campaign. What am I asked the most about the Campaign: How Can I Help?

I enjoy answering this question as there are so many ways that people and groups can get involved. Obviously, in a \$7,000,000 campaign, financial support is very important. But there are other ways to support the campaign. When asked, here's where the conversation ends up:

- Hold a Fund Raising Event – several chapters have already done this. From DorkFest selling parade laps around Laguna Seca to chapters holding 50-50 Raffles at their monthly meetings, fund raising events are only limited by your imagination. Individuals have also reached out about having fund raising parties in their homes. Whatever your idea, give us a call. We will gladly provide assistance, including providing Foundation merchandise for sale or auction.

- Clean out your Garage, Attic and Closets – Did you know that the vast majority of the 50,000+ objects in our Library, Archives and Museum were donated? We are interested in pretty much anything BMW related that you have. Unique items become part of our collection. Duplicate items are used to raise funds. Your donation may very well be tax deductible.

✓. A CHAT WITH DAVID HOBBS

We are pleased to announce the Campaign Honorary Committee: Skip Barber, David Hobbs, Scott Goodyear, and R. J. Valentine. Each of these members is committed to the Foundation's Principles and Programs. This month we share why David Hobbs supports the Foundation.

- Editor

David, many people now know you as an insightful Television broadcaster for F1 on CBS, Speed, and now NBC Sports. However, your racing career spanned an astounding 35+ years including 19 starts at Le Mans, repeated stints in F1 and Indianapolis, the Daytona 500 in NASCAR, the World Endurance Championship, IMSA, and the Can Am. You emerged from this racing career with hardly a scratch! You have been quoted many times that the most dangerous situations you found yourself in during that time were on the public roads. You are a husband, a father, now a grandfather, and a car dealer.

Why did you agree to serve on the Honorary Committee of the BMW CCA Foundation?

Well, I have two sons of my own, and now have two grandsons, 20 and 15 years old! My wife, Margaret, and I now live in the Milwaukee area, and every year there are two or three really horrific teen accidents where multiple teens are needlessly killed. It shocks the community and is extremely sad.

What about the Tire Rack Street Survival® program is poignant to you?

I very much like the fact that the kids are asked to use their own cars as opposed to shiny new vehicles supplied by someone else. You know any new vehicle would have all the bells and whistles on it to perform light years better than the typical ten year old hand-me-down with worn tires that a teen usually drives. To my way of thinking that fact makes the this type of training much more vivid and impactful as it underscores not only the specific limitations of teen's skills and experience but very likely that of the vehicle they are typically driving as well!

Is there any universal "rule of driving" that you would hope all teenage drivers could learn right from the start of their driving experience?

I think the key notion here is the necessity of concentration on what you are doing. Driving is not a multi-tasking environment! And it is really the responsibility of the parents to make sure that is clearly understood by their kids at the outset.



What about modern day driver training do you find disconcerting?

Well, for years, I drove in America on my English license. However, when we relocated here permanently and opened our dealership, I had to go downtown and take the driving test like anybody else to get my American license. To be honest, I was shocked at what a ridiculous exercise it turned out to be, and all of it at 20-25 MPH or less! I had been driving & racing all over the world for some 40 years, and I suspect I barely passed! Learning how to parallel park and use the blinker does not teach you anything about vehicle dynamics, or traffic awareness. I really think society is letting our kids down in that regard.

Do you have any concerns about modern automotive technology?

Like most people, I am quite concerned about the impact of cell phones and texting on today's teens and society in general. It has no business when you are behind the wheel. I see it every day, and it is exceedingly dangerous. In addition, I do not profess to understand the manufacturer's rush to install complicated computer interfaces in new cars today. To my way of thinking it only exacerbates an already dangerous combination of technology vs driver concentration. If I have to get on the computer interface in my car, just to change the radio station, is that progress?

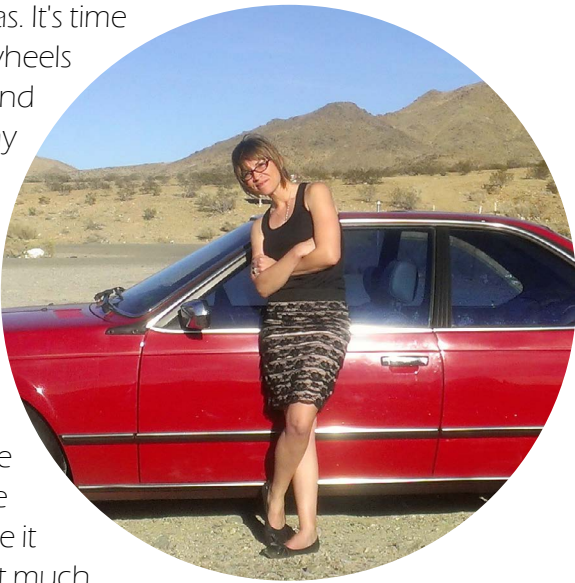
As somebody with a certain enthusiasm, I find myself looking around and being amazed at the fact that there are enthusiasts everywhere I look. Back in January, I took a little cross country adventure to meet and mingle with different CCA Chapters (along with a few other clubs) and see what makes them tick. As I wandered my way across this fantastic country I realized that among the clubs, the passion was consistent.

This passion was for driving, adventure, restoration, and all things automotive related. There wasn't a magical "typical" club, and as I spoke with some of them about the importance of becoming familiar with the BMW CCA Foundation and it's causes they all shared a common bond. They all wanted to help but weren't really sure how. On a broad level the chapters I spoke with said "we already donated a large sum of money as a chapter", but what about as individuals? How can we as individuals creatively raise not just money, but awareness of the importance of the Foundation?

One chapter suggested doing a driving event, much like a "Poker Run" another chapter thought of doing a bake sale, all great ideas. With these ideas, it's almost certain that we as members of the CCA can bump our heads together and come up with some great, out-of-

the-box ideas. It's time to put the wheels in motion, and much like my adventure across the country, I started on one ocean beach and was determined to see the opposite coast. I made it happen, but much like anything that's worth doing right, it took time.

Our goal as a foundation should include not only a long term picture, but a short term agenda. Just like I looked at real paper maps to get me where I was going, let's dig deep and plan some events to bring us together!



✓. WHY I GAVE

Motor vehicle fatality is the leading cause of death to teenagers, representing over one-third of all deaths amongst teens aged 12-19. This is an alarming and frankly unacceptable statistic. While the overwhelming majority of these fatalities are accidents, they're also preventable.

As members of the Car Club, we have the unique ability through Street Survival to better educate our young drivers far beyond any traditional driver education programs. While traditional driver education programs are academic in nature, Street Survival teaches real-world situational awareness. Instead of tiresomely long lectures in a classroom, students are shown – not just taught – in their very own vehicles how to respond to panic situations. The students are engaged (and are often even having fun!), performing high-speed emergency brake maneuvers, skids and overall vehicular control. The program's hands-on training augments an otherwise natural intuition to react in a calculated manner to unexpected and unfamiliar situations. I've had the wonderful opportunity of attending a Fort Worth school recently and one thing is abundantly clear: Street Survival saves lives.

Street Survival is made possible by the support of both the Car Club and the Foundation, their impeccable

staffs and the time and resources of hundreds of volunteers. The cost of attending a Street Survival school (an affordable \$75 for an all-day potentially life-saving event) is heavily subsidized by generous sponsors and Car Club donors. Without this support, the program would be unable to continue to educate our young drivers.

As automobile enthusiasts, we have a moral and ethical responsibility to promote safety behind the wheel, especially when it relates to our next generation of drivers – what better way to do so than through our contributions to a program so close to home... Street Survival.
